

Commodity Supplemental Food Program



What is the Supplemental Food Program?

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program is a USDA program which works to improve the health of low-income seniors 60 years of age and older by supplementing their diets with nutritious foods. The Food Bank packs and distributes 30-pound food boxes containing canned and packaged food including vegetables, fruit juice, pasta, milk, cereal, canned meat and non-meat protein.

How to Apply?

To be eligible, applicants must be at least 60 years old, a resident of Colusa County, and meet the federal income guidelines listed to the right. Eligible applicants must apply in person at a distribution site near his or her residence.

To sign-up for the program

You will need to bring the following documents to a distribution site.

1. Proof of identity (one of the following):

- CA Driver's License
- California I.D. card
- Passport
- Other official government picture I.D.

2. Address Verification:

- Identification with local address
- Any bill with participant's name and local address
